

VIRUS	VACCINE ELIGIBILITY	COST
<p><u>SARS-CoV-2</u></p>	<p>Everyone aged 5 years and older is recommended to receive the new booster shot.</p> <p>Children 6 months to 5 years – depending on previous doses – should get one, two, or three doses of updated COVID-19 vaccine.</p>	<p>Free for most people through their health insurance plan or through Texas Vaccines for Children.</p> <p>Adults 18 years and older without health insurance can get updated COVID-19 vaccines at no cost through the Bridge Access Program.</p>
<p><u>Influenza</u></p>	<p>Everyone aged 6 months and older, after consulting with a physician.</p>	<p>Medicaid, Medicare, and most private insurance cover the cost of the flu vaccine.</p> <p>Under- or uninsured children can get the vaccine through Texas Vaccines for Children.</p> <p>For uninsured adults, many local health departments offer low- to no-cost flu shots.</p>
<p><u>RSV</u></p>	<p>Adults aged 60 and older when recommended by their physician.</p> <p>Recommended for pregnant women in their third trimester.</p>	<p>Medicare Part D covers the RSV vaccine, as does some private insurance (people should check with their insurer).</p>
